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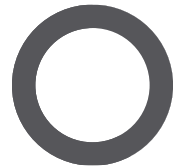

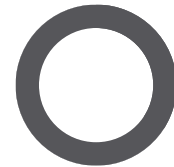
Every Little Star Program is provided free of charge to families.
Over \$135 million dollars worth of Programs have been provided to children with cancer and disadvantaged children, their families and communities.



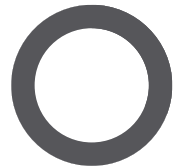

About Little Star Foundation



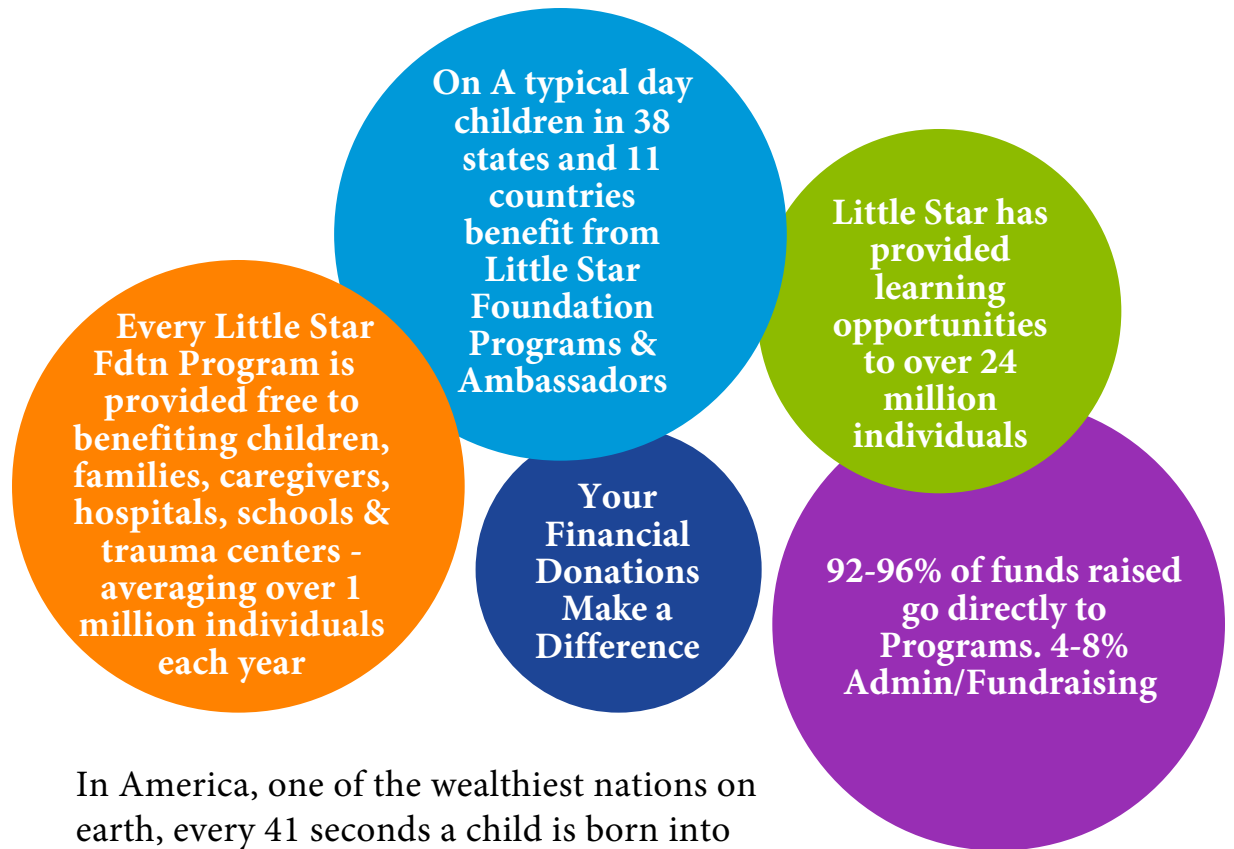
For 39 years Little Star Foundation has provided long term care and a better quality of life for children with cancer and disadvantaged children, their families and caregiver system.

Quality and Reach

Operating throughout the United States and Internationally, Little Star Foundation partnerships include a network of Hospitals, Schools, Youth Programs and Caregiver and Trauma Centers. For nearly 4 decades Little Star Foundation's 24/7 365 day a year Resource Center works closely with Emergency First Responders, Medical Teams, Teachers, Ambassadors, Supporters and Volunteers to sustain Little Star's Award Winning Programs.



In America, one of the wealthiest nations on earth, every 41 seconds a child is born into poverty. 12.8 million children live in poverty and worry where their next meal will come from, whether they will have a safe place to sleep or if they will have equal educational opportunities.

Every two minutes a child is diagnosed with cancer. One in five children in the U.S. diagnosed will not survive. There is a united global goal to achieve at least 60% survival for all children with cancer globally by 2030 doubling the current childhood cancer survival rate worldwide and ensuring children's basic needs are met when poverty-stricken families fall on hard times.

Financial Support:

Little Star Foundation provides financial support to lessen the financial stress & emotional toll a cancer diagnosis and/or life threatening condition brings. Daily & emergency financial support provided.

Medical Care, Hospital & Outreach Support: The suffering & trauma from a child being diagnosed with cancer, any life threatening disease can turn a family's life upside down never to recover. Little Star works with hospital, medical & emergency responder teams to provide critical support.

Educational Programs, Support & Scholarships: Named after Cindy Crawford's brother, Jeff Crawford, who died of cancer as a little boy. The Jeff Crawford Educational Scholarships provide further educational opportunities for children with cancer accepted to Accredited Collegiate Programs. Additionally, Little Star Foundation works with school systems across America to provide increased learning opportunities, equal opportunity leadership and support and scholarships.

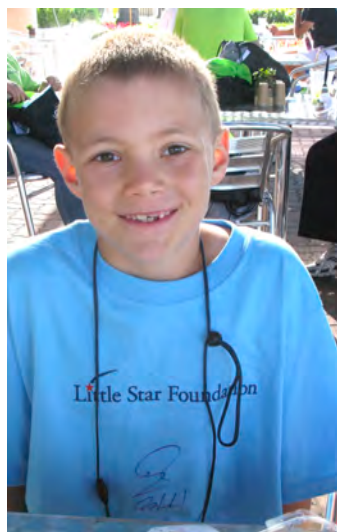

My son, Josh Parker, was with you July 5-11, and I can't begin to tell you what this trip did for him. He left Georgia as a teenager coping with leukemia, and he came home as a young man full of hope, completely rejuvenated, happy, feeling good, and told me 1 story after another for 2 hours driving home from the airport. I know that he could not have gotten that anywhere else. You're nothing short of amazing. I just finished watching the video and couldn't stop the tears of joy. All these kids have traveled a rough road and you can see in their faces how wonderful it was to be there.

I don't know how to thank you enough for what you gave Josh—and as a result, what you gave this family. We have 2 other sons (Ben—age 14 & Louie—age 13) They are thrilled to pieces to have their brother laughing & smiling again. Josh was hesitant to do much of anything before. I think he simply felt out of touch after missing so much school. Now he makes plans to do something every day. He is now

looking forward to his junior year of high school. All of you have a special place in this mother's heart and I will forever be grateful to each & every one of you. He loved every minute of his trip.

There's also so much for all these kids to gain from each other. It's one thing to meet other teenagers at the clinic, but usually they are hooked up to chemo, pretty sick, and only have a few minutes to talk, in a not-so-social environment. At your ranch they have a chance to really get to know each other, in beautiful surroundings with everyone relaxed. What a tremendous gift to give. I pray for blessings for all of you. And I hope you know that what you do for kids cannot be measured. Hope and joy are so very precious—thank you for giving it to Josh.

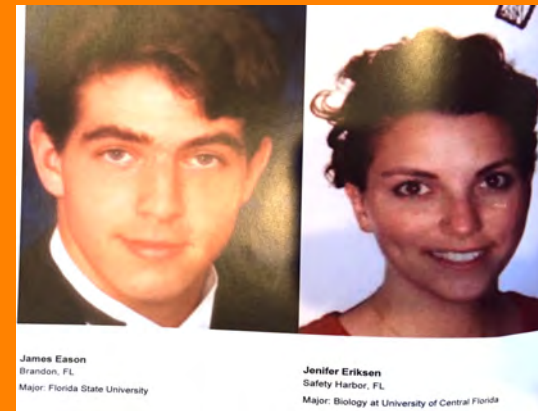


Please accept our most sincere appreciation for including the Los Angeles Unified School District in your area of (program) distribution.

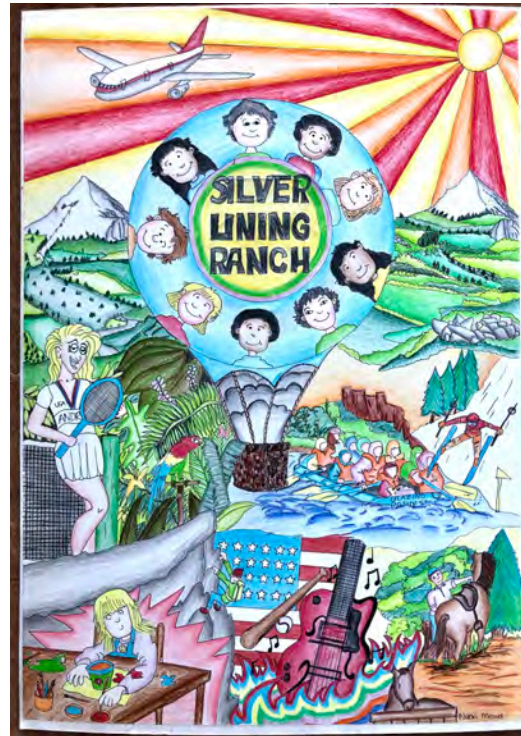
